WiPs/UFOs

Not sure of the difference between a WiP and a UFO. I'd say as WiP is something you've worked on with the last while and a UFO is something you started months or years ago but progress ceased before you finished it.

I took my own advice about seeking out those WiPs/UFOs in my sewing room. I found 32! Yes, I typed that right, thirty-two but I think I also hit on a way to make this more than just a horrible statistic. As I found each project, I gave it a name and noted its dimensions, source of the project, the next step and who it is intended for (if applicable). I also took a photo, like this:

I keep this in my notes app on my phone but a lower tech version such as a notebook could work just as well. I now have the information I need when I need it — for the top shown I can look up how much fabric I need for a backing if I'm shopping for fabric. I can also browse for projects to repurpose — more about that next month!

Among my 32 projects I actually found a Christmas table runner that just needed the faced binding sewn down! It missed the holiday season I started it for and got buried. I completed it this week as I watch the presidential debate, it was

I'm enjoying watching Angela Walter's Machine Quilting with Rulers Challenge. She posts the tutorial on Mondays with a follow up live chat on YouTube on Thursdays; there is also a Facebook Group.
