WHAT'S HAPPENING AT THE NEW ENGLAND QUILT MUSEUM?

The exhibit of Wayside Quilters Guild quilts continues at the New England Quilt Museum until October 17th. The museum is open Tuesday through Saturday, 10:00 am to 4: pm and is not crowded. Masks are required to be worn. In addition to "our" quilts, there is a traveling exhibit "Deeds, Not Words" celebrating the 100th anniversary of women's suffrage, an exhibit of quilts by Cape Cod quilter Celia Macia, and a display of floral

quilts from the museum collection ranging from a c. 1820 coverlet to a quilt by contemporary art quilter Ruth MacDowell. In addition, many Lowell restaurants near the museum have set up outdoor seating on the sidewalks for lunch time dining!

Wayside Quilters Guild members will have free admission to the New England Quilt Museum September 15-19! When you arrive at the museum, tell the staff person (Molly or Jo) that you are a member of Wayside Quilters Guild. The front desk will have an up to date membership list to check. Get those projects finished

Fall is traditionally a time for new starts: a new school year, a new exercise regime, a new resolution to complete WIPs/UFOs....wait...what?!

This Fall, I'm resolving to finish (or discard — daring thought) at least some of my works in progress and turn those unfinished objects into something useable.

Want to join me? Happy to have the company.

This month your mission, should you accept it, is to go through your quilty projects and unearth these long-buried treasures. As you sort them, take a photograph or two for reference.

Here are some possible categories

- just needs binding
- finished flimsy w/backing needs quilting/tying and binding
- finished flimsy needs backing
- finished blocks need setting
- some completed blocks
- orphan blocks
- "I'm never going to finish this but someone else might"
- "this is only good for scraps!" give yourself permission to get rid of it

Once you've done that, I want you to select up to 3 projects you'd like to complete — or at least move to the next stage — by the end of the year. If you're willing, send me (activities@waysidequilters.org) an email with photos and your plan. Keep me posted on your progress. If there's interest I'll set up an accountability group.

Now for those "I'm never going to finish this but someone else might" projects: Send me photos of up to 3 of them with a few details such size and completeness and I'll arrange to get them onto a page on our website to see if anyone wants to take them off your hands. If no takers you can move them to the "this is only good for scraps!" category or box them up and put them in the attic!
