PANDEMIC-INSPIRED WINTER "HOPE" PROJECT: Our unprecedented quarantine has inspired new ways of thinking, new ways of experiencing our lives and more. Where will you find HOPE over the winter months? What positive outcomes will you be experience during this time? What have you learned during this experience? How can you represent this in a quilted project?

#### **Project parameters:**

Between December 21 and March 21 please create a quilted project of any kind that represents your pandemic experience <u>in a</u> <u>way that brings you hope</u>. Aim to complete it by the start of Spring, and we will have an unveiling/Show & Tell at our Guild's April meeting. We hope EVERYONE will participate. During the winter months in the meantime we can share what we are working on and get help and input from our fellow quilters. We have had two fun discussion sessions so far; we will schedule more in February. Watch your email.

- As we have done in the Brown Bag Challenges, we will require the following:
- Circumference must be 72" or less
- Must have three layers: Top, batting and back
- Needs to be bound
- We hope to present an impressive array of our Guild's creative expression by showcasing these pieces in the future....
- Surely at our next show, but perhaps there will be a venue where they can be showcased in the spring of 2021.

#### April 3rd Workshop with Sheila Frampton Cooper

#### <u>Applique + Piecing = New Possibilities.</u>

Sheila is an award winning quilter - her quilts have been exhibited in the US, France, Italy, China, Japan and England. She now lives in California, after having lived in France for a number of years.

In this workshop, students will learn a technique called Appli-piecing, originally developed by Caryl Bryer Fallert-Gentry.

Students will complete small projects using this technique. Sheila has been kind enough to adapt her 2-3 day workshop to a single day.
