Jean Larson said "I go to Facebook's groups - Quilting with Precuts and Mystery Quilt Anonymous. The mystery quilt site is designed by Debbie Montgomery and she doesn't charge anything for her patterns or clues. Very helpful and prolific."

- 1. Off the Cuff, run by Victoria Findlay Wolfe has a short video tutorial each month. This one requires a fee to participate and offers kits for purchase, but I've learned a lot from participating.
- 2, <u>Mosaic Mystery Quilt, run by Cheryl Brickley</u> is no-fee although the pattern will be available for purchase after the QAL ends.

Also, Angela Walters is just about to start another of her free-motion machine QALs and has panels available for purchase or you can piece a top.

I am enjoying a "murder mystery" quilt project for the second year. Block patterns come each month along with a mystery book chapter. Clues are provided monthly as well if you get a photo of your completed block in the album on time. At the end of the year you have to solve the crime for a chance to win a prize. Block instructions are very detailed and often a video is provided. The cost is about \$100.

Tricia Crockett:

Lately, when I'm quilting I listen to the Quilt Fiction podcast. The host, Frances O'Roark Dowell writes books where the characters are quilters. On the podcast she is reading her latest book, one chapter at a time as she writes it! It's set in Ohio in the Great Depression. An unlikely group of women become friends through a sewing circle.
