

#### Planning for the Fall Boutique

Thanks to all of you who shared your great ideas at our February meeting as we begin to plan for the upcoming Boutique at our fall show. The Guild is asking that all members contribute some item(s) that the Guild may sell for Guild profit. Additionally, there are several other options open to you: 1.) you can take up to 85% of the profit for anything that you make and is sold and 2.) you may designate another percentage of profit for the Guild. (For example this would enable you to cover your materials expense and donate the rest.)

Expect to hear more details about additional activities for the Boutique. In the meantime, here are some of the highlights of what we learned:

- While lower priced items sell best at an event like this, we have sold quilts for as much as \$200. What is important is to have a variety of beautiful, handmade items that are available for purchase. And it is difficult to predict what will sell!
- Christmas themed items and ornaments often sell well. If you wish to access some themed material, check with our Outreach folks who have some themed materials you may use to make Boutique items.
- Remember Christmas isn't the only holiday!
   Consider making items with Hanukkah,
   Halloween or Thanksgiving themes.
- Think about how best to display your items when it comes to show time. If there is a way you can provide a display it will be really helpful. (Last time Jill showed her adorable owls on a branch - and they sold like hot-cakes!)
- Pat Lukens showed us some kits she made so a DIY-oriented show attendee could make their own holiday ornaments. All the materials and detailed instructions are included in each bag. Cool idea!

- Janet Columbus came with a wealth of ideas, materials and instructions for a variety of easy-to-make items and ornaments. Check with Janet at the next meeting if you need some inspiration.
- Gayle O'Bryan demonstrated some lovely bowl cozy's that are easy to make. She has the pattern she is happy to share.
- Too many others to name (I'm sorry!) shared ideas, patterns and items that sell well at boutiques. We saw (or discussed) children's aprons, cards, coasters, placemats and more.
- Kate Wellen has small left-over pieces of batting that she offered to give to those who are making small items for the boutique.

Talk to your friends in the Guild to share ideas and patterns. No idea is a bad one - please plan to contribute your creativity ... and have fun with it! thanks -

On **Saturday, March 21**st, Wayside Quilters is offering an all-day workshop with **Marge Tucker.** Have you admired the quilting on many modern quilts? Much of it is done with a walking foot. It is more than straight lines done in the ditch! You can also do gentle curves. Marge will show us tips and techniques in this workshop. Marge is an award winning quilter, and does almost all of her own quilting on her domestic machine, using a walking foot. This workshop is a skill-building workshop. She will share a lot of 'tricks of the trade', as well as information about batting and thread choices. Techniques learned will go far beyond 'stitch in the ditch' and straight stitching.

Barb Vedder will come to run a workshop for the guild on May 9th, 2020 from 9.30 - 3.30pm The workshop is titled "Liberated Houses - Free Piecing Fun. This workshop was chosen because there is very little prep, and plenty of sewing fun. It is also a great way to treat yourself on Mother's Day weekend! This type of piecing is quick and also a fun way to use scraps. This workshop is geared towards all skill levels, and a great way for our guild members to complete a small (or big) quilt for our bi-annual show in September.
